Dr. Mansourati has authored numerous papers on optical networking, and has been published by the Quarterly of Applied Mathematics, and the Canadian Applied Mathematics Society. His expertise has earned Dr. Mansourati many invitations as a featured speaker at high-tech industry events.

“I am delighted to be re-joining the Board and look forward to resume work with my colleagues, including CABA Board members and other association and industry stakeholders,” said Dr. Mansourati. “CABA is a very important organization and industry network that represents the collective interests of both the connected home and building industry.”
